Industry News—Phishing Scam Reports Skyrocket

Reports of a type of online crime known as "phishing" surged by almost 200 percent in April, according to figures from a computer security industry group.

The Anti-Phishing Working Group (APWG) received reports of more than 1,100 unique phishing campaigns in April, a 178 percent increase from the previous month, according to figures shared with the IDG News Service. Phishing occurs when personal information from users is captured from the Internet. Junk e-mail or unsolicited commercial "spam" is then sent to the user along with Web sites that look legitimate, but are not.

Citibank Inc. alone was the target of 475 unique phishing scams in April. Each of those scams is a separate e-mail campaign that could contain tens of thousands or millions of fraudulent e-mail messages.

Ebay Inc. and its online payment service, PayPal, were also hit hard in April. Ebay was the target of 221 unique phishing campaigns, PayPal of 135.

June Internet Tip—You are Notified that you Sent an Infected E-mail when you Sent None

Situation:

One of the following occurred:

You received a notice from your Internet Service Provider (ISP) that your e-mail is undeliverable because the e-mail is infected by a virus or worm. However, you did not send any e-mail messages. Someone claims to have received from you an infected e-mail message, but you have sent no e-mail messages.

You may have scanned all files using Norton AntiVirus with the latest virus definitions, and nothing was detected, but you are afraid that Norton AntiVirus is not detecting the threat.

Solution:

This behavior can occur for the following reasons:

Your computer is infected.

Another person's computer is infected with a mass-mailing worm and your e-mail address is on that computer.

If this is the case, the worm can randomly add your e-mail address to the "From" line of every e-mail message that it sends. This makes it appear that you have sent the e-mail when you have not.
